WERTHEIMER PARK
781 SOUTH MAIN STREET
Leopold Wertheimer bequeathed the land to the City in 1913. In 1948, the Sawtooth Rangers Riding Club hosted the first rodeo here. In 1999, the Hailey Skate Park was built here and in 2015 the Campion Ice House opened. The park is also home to the Heritage Banners, which honor Hailey's history, and the Mutton Busting sculpture.

THE GOOD SHEPARD MONUMENT
ROBERTA MCKERCHER PARK
3RD AVE SOUTH & MAIN STREET
Featuring 11 life-sized bronzed sheep, a shepherd, a horse and a dog, Danny Edwards' sculpture honors the annual Trailing of the Sheep Festival and has been welcoming people to Hailey since 2021.

TIMELESS PORTAL & KALEIDOSCOPE
ROBERTA MCKERCHER PARK
3RD AVE SOUTH & MAIN STREET
Marks Stasz's "Timeless Portal" is a site-specific sculpture commissioned in 2010 and represents the artist's family and the surrounding rivers and mountains. The interactive Kaleidoscope was donated by the Seagraves Foundation in 2019.

HAILEY ARBORETUM
SOUTH MAIN STREET AND FOX ACRES ROAD
Located just off the Wood River Trail and behind the Welcome to Hailey sign, the Arboretum was created in 1996 and features native trees and plants, including both the Idaho State Tree, Western White Pine, and Flower, Syringa.

SKATEBOARD BENCH & RAILS TO TRAILS MONUMENT
WOOD RIVER TRAIL - FOX ACRES ROAD
Artist Bob Wiederrick created the Skateboard Bench in 2013 in honor of his son. The historical group, E Clampus Vitus, erected a monument to the area's railroad history turned bike path in 2018.

HAILEY TRAIN DEPOT INTERPRETATIVE SIGN
WOOD RIVER TRAIL - EAST CROY STREET
Site of the former train depot that served the Oregon Short Line of the Union Pacific Railroad Company, the sign honors Hailey's mining and livestock history.

EZRA POUND HOME
314 2ND AVE SOUTH
Built in 1883, poet Ezra Pound was born here in 1885. Local journalist Roberta McKercher lived here until her passing in 1996. It's now owned by the Sun Valley Museum of Art.

COMMUNITY BAPTIST CHURCH
202 2ND AVE SOUTH
Built in 1886 as a Methodist Church, the bell tower rings out every hour, from 10am to 6pm daily.

BLAINE COUNTY COURT HOUSE
206 1ST AVE SOUTH
The cornerstone of the building was laid in 1883 and when finished it became the most expensive building in the Idaho Territory at the time, costing \$40,000 to complete.

MASONIC LODGE
100 2ND AVE SOUTH
Originally located above The Mint bar on Main Street, the lodge opened at its current location in 1900. Following a fire, it was rebuilt in 1937.

EMMANUEL EPISCOPAL CHURCH
101 2ND AVE SOUTH
Hailey's oldest church was built in 1885 out of bricks formed in Quigley Canyon. The picturesque church offers a small memorial garden.

CHASE, SNIDER. BURKE HOME
203 EAST BULLION
Originally built by U.S. Marshall Eben Chase in 1882, the property has been home to two famous Hailey women; Maria Snider, who was known for her Italian cooking, and Mayor Martha "Beaver" Burke.

FOX/ WORSWICK/ NELSON HOME
119 EAST BULLION
One of Hailey's original log homes built in 1881. The Wood River Land Trust restored the home and has many artifacts from its history on display inside the building.

ASSAY OFFICE
19 EAST BULLION
Built in 1907, the little red building has been used to assay ore from local mines, as the local library and the Episcopal Church thrift store.
- 15

BOW BRIDGE MURAL
106 SOUTH MAIN STREET - JANE'S ARTIFACTS
In 2019, the Hailey Arts and Historic Perseveration Commission hired local artist, Kevin Fitzpatrick, to paint a mural of his depiction of a Great Horned Owl perched by the Bow Bridge.

W.A.T.E.R. CLUB MURAL
106 SOUTH MAIN STREET - JANE'S ARTIFACTS
Wood River High School's W.A.T.E.R. Club put up the mural created by local artist, Lella Aicher, in 2020. It honors the environmental and cultural diversity in Hailey.

BLAINE COUNTY HISTORICAL MUSEUM & MURAL
218 NORTH MAIN STREET
Opened in 1964, the Historical Museum is located in a building that has served numerous roles since first constructed in 1882. The museum is home to thousands of historical artifacts as well as the Union Pacific Mural and the National Votes for Women Trail marker.

SHEEP SCULPTURE
MYRTLE AND MAIN STREETS
Jacob Novinger's colorful Sheep Sculpture was commissioned in 2019.

HOP PORTER PARK
WEST BULLION STREET
Known as Hailey Tourist Park starting back in 1922, it was renamed after local, Hop Porter, who helped save and expand the park. It's home to a large children's playground, is a popular spot for summer concerts and is hosts artist John Zender Estrada's Day of the Dead Mural.

BOW BRIDGE AND HAILEY GREENWAY
In 2012, the Wood River Land Trust created the Bow Bridge that spans the Big Wood River and is part of the 1.5 miles of trails through the Hailey Greenway.
